Introduction to Tweetily WordPress plugin.



Tweetily is a FREE WordPress plugin that creates Twitter updates of your WordPress websites pages and blog posts. Tweetily does not have to wait for new content to be created before it creates a status update. Tweetily will post as much as you want, at the approximate time intervals that you want and will repost random pages and posts.

Tweetily is always running even when you are logged off your computer!

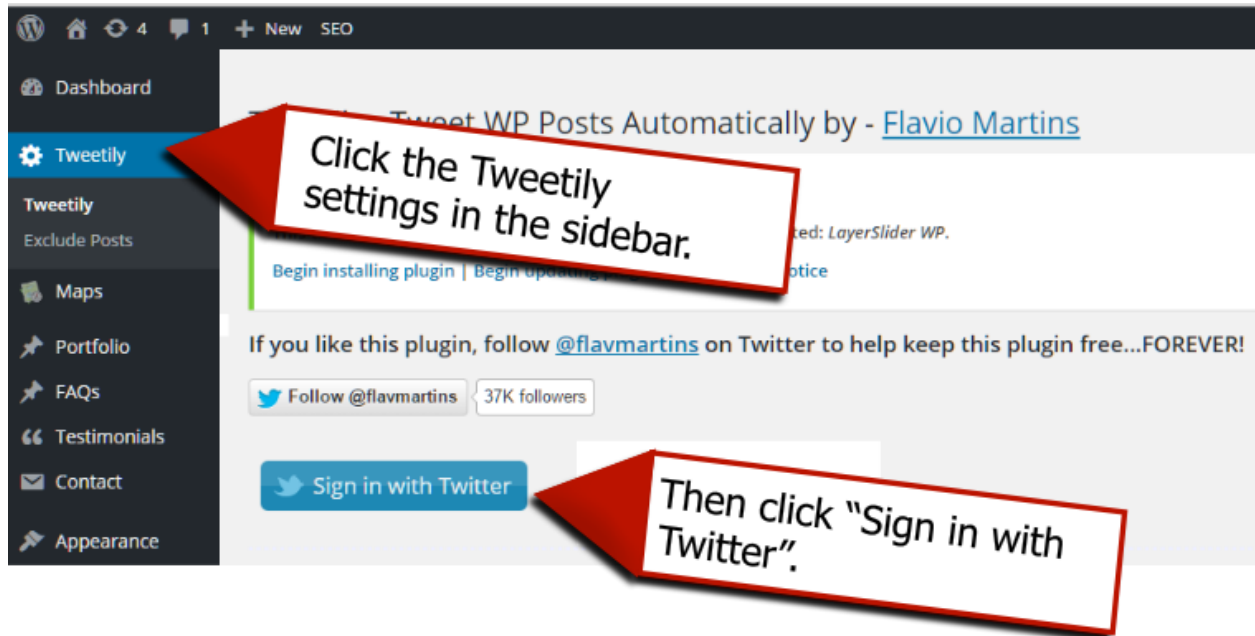

Configuring Tweetily:

Download and install Tweetily like any other WordPress plugin.

Once installed click on the Tweetily options in the sidebar and sign into Twitter. Before clicking the "Sign in with Twitter" button be sure that your browser profile is signed in to the Twitter profile that you want Tweetily to post to.



Now that you have Tweetily installed you will have to configure it for it to work how you want it to.

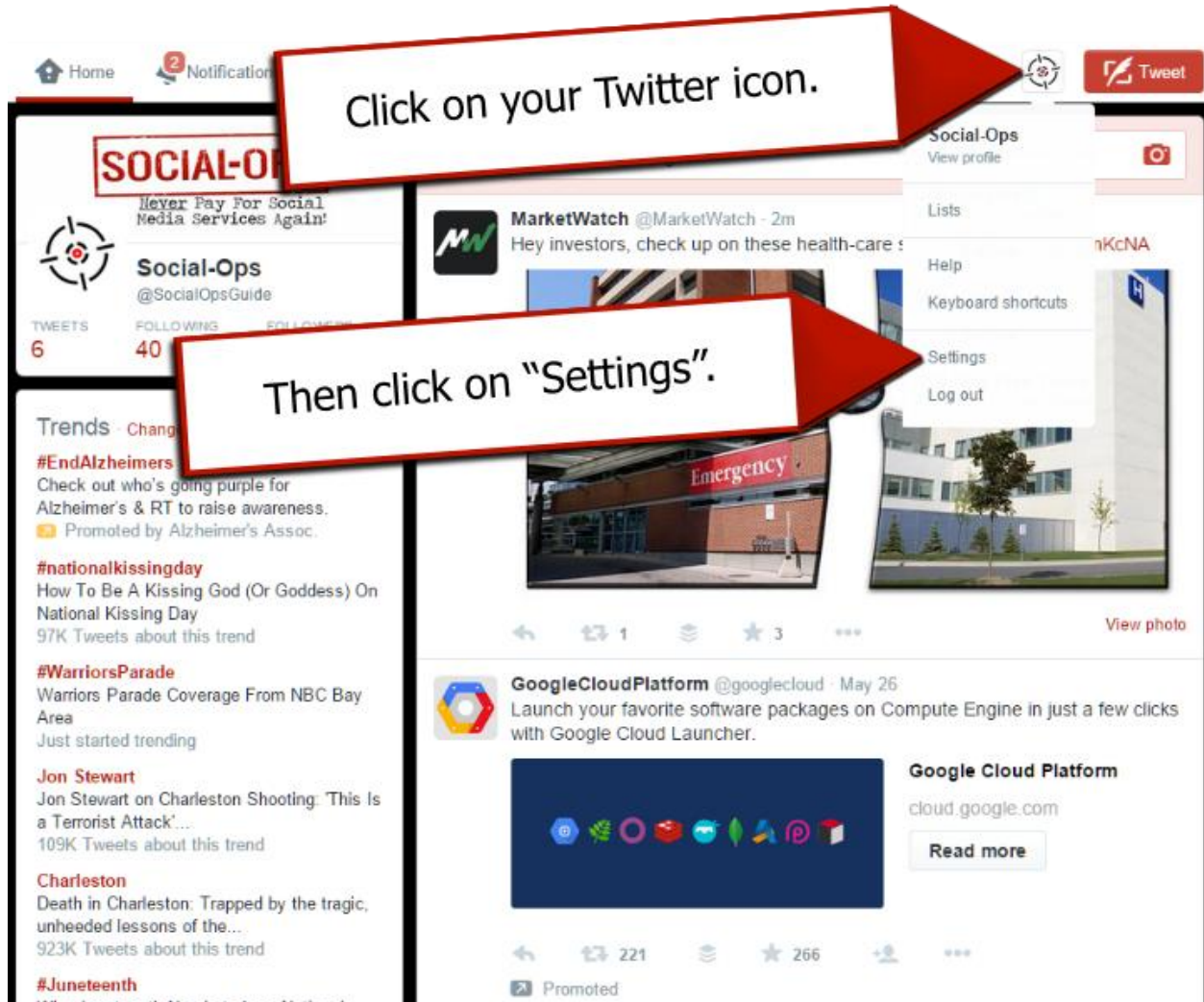

Configuring Tweetily is pretty self-explanatory and a matter of personal preference. At the bottom of the configuration options you will be able to test Tweetily to help you dial in the automatic status updates.

Configure Twitter to update Facebook!

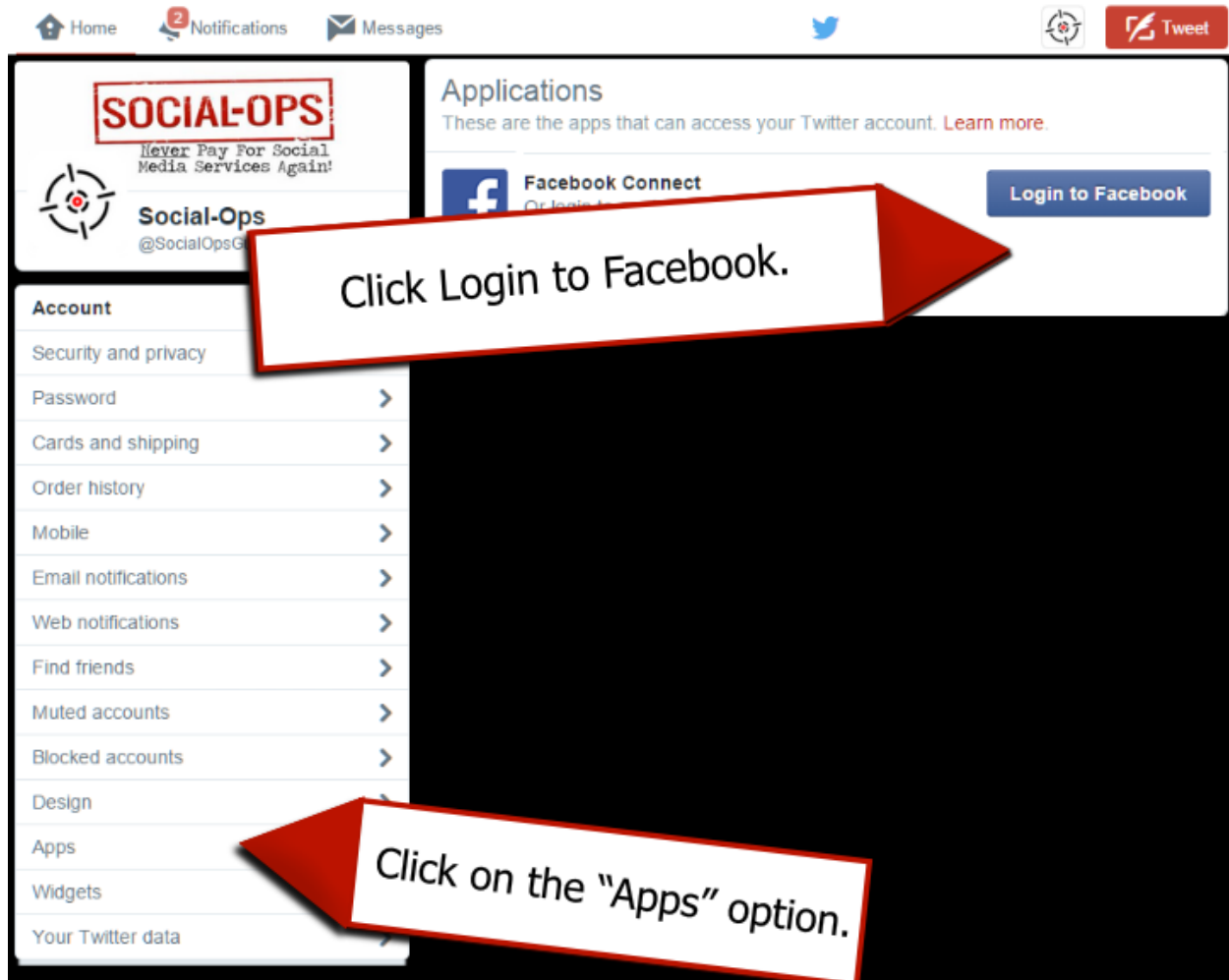

Click on the "Apps" option within the left side of the next page that comes up. After you click on the Apps icon an option to connect to Facebook pops up. Use the login button to login to Facebook.

Once logged into Facebook via Twitter you have the option to connect to your personal Facebook page or choose a Facebook business page for Twitter to syndicate posts to.
